Community Review Comments

Via Parks Board Meeting Chat		
1	Ed Contreras	HOA parks are private and not accessible to general public. Many of the parks in the south have city parks also.
2	Jerry and Sue McInturf	HOA pickleball courts are private.
3	Jerry and Sue McInturf	ALL HOA pickleball courts are private!!
4	Melanie Dykstra	Does the city own Bear Creek? Where is it located?
5	Melanie Dykstra	How many urban fishing lakes do we have?
6	Melanie Dykstra	To clarify the recommended level of service was calculated for Chandler based on the factors listed and didn't just rely on National standards that don't account for HOA areas correct?
7	Ed Contreras	If you are planning to include HOA parks, is the city planning to contribute to the improvement and/or amenities?
8	Bryan Lang	I joined late but i heard a mention for the orange tree park, are there any plans in the works for the city to acquire that land for the use of a park?
9	Dean Brennan	The Equity map for the area of north of Elliot Rd. is incorrect for the HOA service areas. The HOA recreation amenities service areas are much smaller and co-terminus with the HOA boundaries.
10	Dean Brennan	Which city department is responsible for preparing the bike/trails master plan?
11	Ingrid Hagen	I wrote a letter to the City Council recently asking for immediate attention to the basin owned by Cathedral of Praise on Bull Moose N. of Warner that is not being maintained. I pick up garbage syringes, beer cans several times a week on the Cathedral of Praise property as well as the basin. I received one phone call from the City indicating the City was working with the owner, but no further information. This basin on Bull Moose, N. of the Cathedral of Praise Church, should be converted a City of Chandler Park,-- Orangetree has NO neighborhood park. How is this not a priority? This has been a problem for the Orangetree Neighborhood for over 30 years!
12	Bryan Lang	Totally agree, Ingrid!
13	Dean Brennan	The National Recreation and Parks Association(NRPA) and the Trust for Public Land(TBL) both recommend that residents live within a 10 minute walk of a park. Did you address this standard in the plan? If not, why was that not considered?
14	Ed Contreras	I live in the Heatherbrook Subdivision, North of Orangetree. I am concerned that area does not have a city park of its own in the one or two mile service area? How long do we have to wait for a city park or additional services that the rest of the city residents currently enjoy and still pay taxes on a year to year basis?
